At 6:00 p.m. Mayor Jordan called the meeting to order, announced a quorum present, and Mayor Pro-Tem Amthor led the Invocation and Pledges.

PUBLIC HEARING:

A public hearing was opened in regard to a change in zoning for the property, Cherokee Street fronting, Block 23, Lots 3 and 4 (117.5'x122'), Liveoak Street fronting Block 30 Lots 1 and 2 (117.5'x122'), and purchase a 10'x122'alleyway located between Block 23 Lots 3 and 4 and Block 30 Lots 1 and 2, from (R-4) Multi-Family Residential to (C-2) Commercial-Local and Through Highway Business in order to install an RV Park. The public hearing was then opened to receive input from the public. The Planning and Zoning Commission Met in Open Session on February 8, 2018 and approved the Change in Zoning on a Vote of 4 to 0. No citizens were present to express their views.

The Public Hearing was closed at 6:04 p.m.

JOINT ELECTION AGREEMENT

This Agreement is entered into between the City of San Saba acting herein by and through its City Council, and the San Saba Independent School District acting by and through its Board of Trustees for the purpose of conducting joint elections for members of their respective governing bodies, do hereby agree as follows:

- 1. The San Saba Independent School District and City of San Saba mutually agree to conduct a joint election at the City Council Chambers at 303 S. Clear Street, San Saba, Texas on May 5, 2018 and;
- 2. The San Saba Independent School District will authorize the City of San Saba to appoint Election Officials and set compensation at an hourly rate not less than the federal minimum hourly wage, and
- 3. The San Saba Independent School District will reimburse the City of San Saba one-half (1/2) of all costs incurred from joint election, and;
- 4. In the event either entity is not required to hold an election, the entity conducting an election will be responsible for all election expenses; and
- 5. The San Saba Independent School District will authorize the City of San Saba to conduct all aspects of the early voting and will reasonably compensate the City of San Saba for rental of council chambers to conduct the early voting and election day, and;
- 6. Each entity will provide its own ballot box, its own ballots, canvass their own election results, and issue certificates of election to candidates elected, and;
- 7. Each entity will be the custodian for their election records.
- 8. Per Section 141.040 of the Election Code, the City Secretary will prepare the joint filing period notice to be posted at each filing authority entity.
- 9. The City of San Saba will publish the joint applicable Notice of Election in the San Saba News & Star.

RESOLUTION 2018-04

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SAN SABA TO WAIVE AN ORDINANCE DEFINING NOISE NUISANCES

WHEREAS, the City of San Saba desires to regulate and oversee any unreasonable loud, disturbing, unnecessary noise which causes material distress, discomfort or injury to persons of ordinary sensibilities in the immediate vicinity.

WHEREAS, the playing of any radio, phonograph or other musical instrument in such manner or with such volume, particularly during the hours between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m. as to annoy or disturb the quiet, comfort or repose of persons of ordinary sensibilities in any dwelling, hotel or other type of residence is prohibited.

WHEREAS, Lynn Blankenship, President of the San Saba County Historical Museum, San Saba, Texas, has asked the City Council to waive Ordinance No. 1967-4 to allow music to be played at Mill Pond Park on March 3, 2018 until 12:00 midnight for a Historic Celebration, "Night at the Museum".

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of San Saba is hereby authorizing the playing of music from 10:00 to 12:00 midnight on March 3, 2018 at Mill Pond Park.

DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS:

The first discussion/action item was to discuss and consider approval of Resolution No. 2018-07 requesting to apply for a JAG Grant for a vehicle and equipment purchase through the Office of the Governor Criminal Justice Division. City Manager Weik explained to the Council that the San Saba Police Department is requesting to submit a JAG Grant for a vehicle and equipment and must have Council approval before submitting the application. On a motion by Alderman Whitten and seconded by Alderman Behrens, Resolution No. 2018-07 was unanimously passed.

RESOLUTION 2018-07

SAN SABA POLICE DEPARTMENT JAG GRANT VEHICLE AND EQUIPMENT PURCHASE

WHEREAS, the San Saba City Council finds it in the best interest of the citizens of the City of San Saba, that the San Saba Police Department Vehicle and Equipment Purchase be operated for 1 year; and

WHEREAS, the San Saba City Council agrees to provide applicable matching funds for the said project as required by Office of the Governor/JAG grant application; and

WHEREAS, the San Saba City Council agrees that in the event of loss or misuse of the Office of the Governor funds, the San Saba City Council assures that the funds will be returned to the Office of the Governor in full;

WHEREAS, the San Saba City Council designates the City of San Saba Chief of Police as the grantee's authorized official. The authorized official is given the power to apply for, accept, reject, alter or terminate the grant on behalf of the applicant agency.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the San Saba City Council approves submission of the grant application for the San Saba Police Department Equipment Purchase to the Office of the Governor.

The second discussion/action item was to Discuss and Consider approval of Ordinance No. 2018-01 an Ordinance of the City of San Saba, Texas, amending Chapter 14, Zoning Code, Article XI., "C-1" Central Business District and Article XII., "C-2" Local and Through Highway Business District of the San Saba Code of Ordinances by Adding Architectural Standards; Providing for Compliance of Existing Structures; Providing for a Repealer; Providing for Severability; Providing an Open Meeting Clause and Establishing an Effective Date. City Manager Weik explained that this Ordinance would ensure that new structures or remodeled structures expanded by more than 20 percent facing the Street on US Highway 190 and Highway 16, the C-1 Central Business District and C-2 Local and Through Highway Business Disrict, there will be restrictions on the façade and will have to be approved before construction. The exterior portion of the building only, that faces the street will need to be Brick, Stucco, Rock, Cultured/Cast Stone, or Architecturally Finished Block. On a motion by Alderman Oliver and seconded by Alderman Behrens, Council approved Ordinance No. 2018-01 by a 4 to 1 vote. Alderman Behrens, Alderman Peeler, Alderman Whitten, and Alderman Oliver voted Aye. Mayor Pro-Tem Amthor voted Nay.

CITY OF SAN SABA, TEXAS

ORDINANCE NO. 2018-01

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SAN SABA, TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER 14, ZONING CODE, ARTICLE XI. "C-1" CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT AND ARTICLE XII., "C-2" LOCAL AND THROUGH HIGHWAY BUSINESS DISTRICT OF THE SAN SABA CODE OF ORDINANCES BY ADDING ARCHITECTURAL STANDARDS; PROVIDING FOR COMPLIANCE OF EXISTING STRUCTURES; PROVIDING FOR A REPEALER; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING AN OPEN MEETINGS CLAUSE AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the City of San Saba, Texas (the "City") is authorized to regulate architectural standards to provide for the public health, safety, and welfare;

WHEREAS, providing architectural and development guidance on construction style to maintain certain districts within the City and promote blending of such diverse uses within such districts;

WHEREAS, the use of specific exterior architectural and design elements contributes to greater community health and well-being; and

WHEREAS, the public health, safety, and welfare will be served by updating certain building construction requirements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN SABA, TEXAS, THAT:

Section 1. Findings. The foregoing recitals are hereby found to be true and correct and are incorporated herein as findings of fact.

Section 2. Addition to Chapter 14. The City of San Saba Code of Ordinances is hereby amended by adding Section 11.10 to Article XI (Architectural Masonry Standards for Central Business District) to read as follows:

* * * * *

ARTICLE XI.

"C-1" CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT

Sec. 11.10 Architectural and Masonry Standards for Central Business District

- (a) All buildings or structures that are built or rebuilt within the "C-1" zoning districts must have all of the exterior walls that face any portion of State Highway 16 or U.S. Route 190, excluding doors and windows, constructed with a masonry façade. No blank walls shall face either of the highways.
 - (1) The following approved masonry list shall apply:
 - a. Stone, brick, or tile laid up unit by unit and set in mortar;
 - b. Stucco (exterior Portland cement plaster with 3 coats over metal lath or wire fabric lath);
 - c. Cultured stone or cast stone; or
 - d. Architecturally finished block (i.e., burnished block, split faced concrete masonry units, or architecturally finished tilt wall)
 - (2) A maximum of 10% of the façade may include accent materials not listed on the approved masonry list in subsection (1) above.
- (b) Existing structures as of the adoption date of this ordinance shall be exempt from these nonresidential design standards.

(c) If existing structures are expanded by 20% or more of their original size, all new construction shall comply with these design standards.

Section 3. Addition to Chapter 14. The City of San Saba Code of Ordinances is hereby amended by adding Section 12.10 to Article XII (Architectural Masonry Standards for Local and Through Highway Business District) to read as follows:

* * * * *

ARTICLE XII. "C-2" LOCAL AND THROUGH HIGHWAY BUSINESS DISTRICT

Sec. 12.10 Architectural and Masonry Standards for Central Business District

- (d) All buildings or structures that are built or rebuilt within the "C-2" zoning district must have all of the exterior walls that face any portion of State Highway 16 or U.S. Route 190, excluding doors and windows, constructed with a masonry façade. No blank walls shall face either of the highways.
 - (3) The following approved masonry list shall apply:
 - a. Stone, brick, or tile laid up unit by unit and set in mortar;
 - b. Stucco (exterior Portland cement plaster with 3 coats over metal lath or wire fabric lath);
 - c. Cultured stone or cast stone; or
 - d. Architecturally finished block (i.e., burnished block, split faced concrete masonry units, or architecturally finished tilt wall)
 - (4) A maximum of 10% of the façade may include accent materials not listed on the approved masonry list in subsection (1) above.
- (e) Existing structures as of the adoption date of this ordinance shall be exempt from these nonresidential design standards.
- (f) If existing structures are expanded by 20% or more of their original size, all new construction shall comply with these design standards.

Section 4. Severability. If any provision of this Ordinance or the application of any provision to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable.

Section 5. Repeal. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in force when the provisions of this Ordinance becomes effective which are inconsistent with or in conflict with the terms and provisions contained herein are hereby repealed only to the extent of such conflict.

Section 6. Open Meetings. It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance was passed was open to the public as required and that public notice of the time, place, and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551, Texas Government Code.

Section 7. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect on February 12, 2018.

PASSED AND APPROVED this 12th day of February, 2018.

The third discussion/action item was to Discuss and Consider approving a Zoning Change for Property, Cherokee Street fronting, Block 23, Lots 3 and 4 (117.5'x122'), Liveoak Street fronting Block 30, Lots 1 and 2 (117.5'x122') and purchase a 10'x122' alleyway located between Block 23, Lots 3 and 4, and Block 30, Lots 1 and 2 from (R-4) Multi-Family Residential to (C-2) Commercial-Local and Through Highway Business in order to install an RV Park. City Manager Weik explained that Mr. Rodriguez is asking to close and purchase the alleyway and change the zoning from (R-4) Multi-Family Residential to (C-2) Commercial-Local and Through Highway Business. It has been explained to Mr. Rodriguez that he will have to show the City plans and hopefully the design will be more spacious. Mr. Rodriguez understands that when the property is zoned Commercial, he will be responsible for paying Commercial property taxes and all of the water, sewer, and electrical rates will be charged commercial. He will also have to pull permits and all work done will need to be performed by Licensed Electricians and Plumbers. On a motion by Mayor Pro-Tem Amthor and seconded Alderman Behrens Council unanimously agreed to the Zoning Change from (R-4) Multi-Family Residential to (C-2) Commercial-Local and Through Highway Business in order to install an RV Park for Property, Cherokee Street fronting, Block 23, Lots 3 and 4 (117.5'x122'), Liveoak Street fronting Block 30, Lots 1 and 2 (117.5'x122') and the purchase of a 10'x122' alleyway located between Block 23, Lots 3 and 4, and Block 30, Lots 1 and 2.

The fifth discussion/action item was presented prior to the fourth to Discuss and Consider approving the closure and sale of an unopened portion of Dry Street to Linda Harvell as indicated in puple on Exhibit "A" contingent upon abutting property owner, with the option to purchase a 42.7' triangle portion of Dry Street that abuts his property. City Manager Weik explained that the unopened portion of Dry Street that abuts Linda Harvell's property, as indicated on Exhibit "A" is the portion she is asking the City to purchase and close. The City has been given a fair market value provided by the San Saba County Appraisal District and it is based upon the value of the properties in the area. He also explained that a letter will be sent out to Mr. Faught and he has the option to purchase the small 42.7' triangular portion of Dry Street that abuts his property. Ms. Harvell is looking to purchase the large triangle portion of property on the other side of the unopened Dry Street adjacent to her property as shown on Exhibit "A". After a lengthy discussion regarding property owners having access to their property and without a survey of the complete area, and a conflict of the exact location of Dry Street and CR 302, Mayor Pro-Tem Amthor made a motion to approve the closure and sale of the unopened portion of Dry Street to Linda Harvell as indicated in purple on Exhibit "A" contingent upon abutting property owner, with the option to purchase a 42.7' triangle portion of Dry Street that abuts his property, contingent upon surveys and ownership of land not to effect any of the adjacent property owner access to their property, relying on a completed survey, the motion was seconded by Alderman Peeler and Council unanimously agreed. Mayor Pro-Tem Amthor made a motion to amend the previous motion to add to approve the Closure and Sale of the portion of Dry Street as indicated on Exhibit "A" to include contingent upon property owners where Dry Street and CR 302 intersect, this will not affect any and all surrounding property owners having access to their property. Alderman Peeler seconded the amended motion and Council approved unanimously.

The fourth discussion/action item was presented last to Discuss and Consider approving the closure and sale of alleyway to Linda Harvell as indicated in green on Exhibit "A" contingent upon abutting property owner, with the option to purchase the 10.45'x125.4' portion of alleyway that abuts his property. Mr. Weik explained that Linda Harvell owns all of the adjacent property on each side of the alleyway with the exception of the 10.45'x125.4' portion of alleyway that abuts Mr. Faught's property and we will send a letter giving him the option to purchase that portion. Mayor Pro-Tem Amthor made a motion, Alderman Behrens seconded, and was unanimously approved the closure and

sale of alleyway to Linda Harvell as indicated in green on Exhibit "A" contingent upon abutting property owner, with the option to purchase the 10.45'x125.4' portion of alleyway that abuts Mr. Faught's property.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT: City Manager Weik gave a brief report on the following activities in the City of San Saba: Great month with traffic increase; Lift Station at the Shady Shores up and running, requiring Shady Shores to install a bar screen and waiting for them to do so; G&R Grocery open and continues to grow, talk of pull-up for groceries; Street lamps for the sidewalk due in; Met with TxDOT they will be coming to town to remove the tanks on Highway 16 and Commerce Street; Found Media will be bringing the busses to San Saba in April transporting twelve writers from Austin, Ft. Worth, USA Today to sample goods, this will be priceless if we get a few articles; Farrel and the guys in the Parks Department are redoing the rock work at the Gazebo and the Veteran's Monument; Numerous complaints regarding people parking vehicles in their yards; KSSB is looking at recommendations for updating the Sign Ordinance, will not overrule TxDOT or the Historical Commission.

OTHER REPORTS: Department Supervisor Scott Glaze, Public Works, reported a month of hard-to-find water leaks, at the Housing Authority, Dollar General, Annex Street; Bruce Stewart, Code Enforcement Officer reported issuing Permits, a lot of inspections, trying to get people in town to clean their property up.

As there was no further discussion, the meeting adjourned at 7:02 p.m.
