At 6:00 p.m. Mayor Jordan called the meeting to order, announced a quorum present, and Alderman Oliver led the invocation and pledges.

**PUBLIC HEARING:**

Mayor, Ken Jordan welcomed everyone and opened the Public Hearing to hear comments from the public regarding rezoning 206 N. Clear Street owned by Larry Davis and Jerilyn McKinney. The property is currently zoned Residential (R-2), requesting to rezone to Commercial (C-2). The Planning and Zoning Commission met in Open Session on May 4, 2017 to consider this change in zoning. They recommended on a vote of 4-0 to approve to rezone property located a 206 N. Clear Street from Residential (R-2) to Commercial (C-2).

The public hearing was closed at 6:02 p.m.

**WHEREAS**, Tony Guidroz, Director of the Economic Development Committee, San Saba, Texas has requested from the City Council of the City of San Saba for permission to close the portion of Cherokee Street located between Wallace and Commerce Streets June 10, 2017 from 3:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m.

The second discussion/action item was to discuss and consider approval of Ordinance No. 2017-04 an Ordinance to grant a change in zoning for property located at 206 N. Clear Street owned by Larry Davis and Jerilyn McKinney currently zoned Residential (R-2) to Commercial (C-2). City Manager Weik explained that Bar-D needs additional parking and Larry and Jerilyn plan to install additional parking on the lot located at 206 N. Clear Street. The parking lot will be located directly behind their current parking. They will install a fence between the parking lot and the neighbor. The parking lot will be gravel parking and the customers will be able to drive from one lot directly to the other. All of the Pecan Trees will be saved. On a motion by Alderman Oliver, seconded by Alderman Peeler, Council unanimously approved Ordinance No. 2017-04.

ORDINANCE NO. 2017-04

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE BOUNDARIES OF A ZONING DISTRICT WITHIN THE CITY OF SAN SABA, TEXAS

WHEREAS, Larry Davis and Jerilyn McKinney applied to the Planning and Zoning Commission requesting that property, described as a 75'x120' TRACT of land out of the Northwest Portion of Block No. 7 of the Old Town Division of the Town of San Saba, San Saba County, Texas (Exhibit A) located at 206 N. Clear Street be changed from R-2 "Residence District" to C-2 "Commercial" to Install a Parking Lot; and,

WHEREAS, the said Planning and Zoning Commission proceeded to hear said zone changes in accordance with the requirements of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of San Saba, Texas; and,

WHEREAS, the said Planning and Zoning Commission, after duly considering said zone changes in accordance with the provisions of said Ordinance, did recommend to the City Council of the City of San Saba that such requested zoning changes be granted; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of San Saba did give notice as required by said Zoning Ordinance for a public hearing to be held on same in accordance with the said Zoning Ordinance, which hearing was set for Tuesday, May 9<sup>th</sup>, 2017 at 6:00 p.m.; and,

WHEREAS, after deliberation on the facts involved in the zoning change, the City Council of the City of San Saba is of the opinion that such zoning changes should be made.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of San Saba that the property located at 206 N. Clear Street be changed from R-2 to C-2 zoning classification.

PASSED AND APPROVED this the 9<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2017

The third discussion/action item was to discuss and consider approval of Resolution No. 2017-19 a Resolution confirming the support of proposed Multi-family Townhome development located at approximately 206 North Harkey Street, San Saba, Texas with AJC Investment Corp. & or assigns. Mr. Weik addressed the Council and explained that this is the same property as before, but we need to reapprove the previous paperwork since it was streamlined toward Texas Housing Foundation contingent upon the sale of the property. Mr. Weik introduced Andy Hansen with Trafalgar Homes and Mr. Hansen gave the Council an overview of their plans for this project. Mr. Hansen explained that there is a demand for housing and they have two recent development, one in Stephenville and one in Brownwood. They are also considering one in Early and the one here in San Saba. Trafalgar Homes has been in business and since 1995 and Mr. Hansen has been in Real Estate for about twenty-five years. Trafalgar Homes has built hundreds of homes and thousands of Apartments. They employ about forty employees from cutting grass to construction crews. Trafalgar Homes will develop and complete up and going. The housing will be affordable for here and as to how many, five will be too few and fifty too many. They have trades and supplier, Trafalgar develops, only one person to blame, and very community oriented. Mr. Hansen introduced Wes Bishop, General Contractor/Designer, he will be the person heading up the job. They are looking to have a combined staff between Early and the City of San Saba which will create two to two and one half or three jobs. Mayor Jordan asked if they will mow the backyards or will that be the responsibility of the tenant. Mr. Hansen said that it would be optional, however some of the tenants have toys and other items so, they prefer to do their own. City Manager Weik explained that they do qualify for a Tax Abatement and are not asking for anything up front. Mayor Jordan asked Mr. Hansen how many bedrooms will

be in each unit. Mr. Hansen replied that there will be one and two bedroom units and this is an eight-step process. We are now at step three. He also explained that he will be building Townhomes vs Apartments, they are better due to not having anyone living over them. Mr. Hansen said the staff has been great to visit with and he has also visited with Arrowhead Bank and CNB regarding the financing. Mayor Pro-Tem Amthor asked what the process would be for construction. Mr. Hansen explained that they would build eleven units at a time and the first eleven would take about seventy-five days if all goes well, they are assembly builders, not custom and will have upgraded countertops with granite, etc. On a motion by Alderman Peeler, seconded by Alderman Behrens, Council unanimously approved Resolution No. 2017-19.

### RESOLUTION NO. 2017-19

**WHEREAS, AJC Investment Corp. & or assigns** has proposed a development for market rate rental housing located at approximately **206 North Harkey St. in the City of San Saba;** and

**WHEREAS, AJC Investment Corp. & or assigns** has advised that it intends to submit an Unimproved Property Contract to the City of San Saba for a **Multi-Family Townhome development.**

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** that the **City of San Saba,** acting through its governing body, hereby confirms that it **supports** the proposed **Multi-family Townhome development located at approximately 206 North Harkey St, San Saba, Texas** and that this formal action has been taken to put on record the opinion expressed by the City of San Saba on May 9, 2017, and furthermore agrees to provide support from the city in a form to be determined later and in an amount with a value greater than \$100 or such greater amount as determined to be de minimis by AJC Investment Corp. & or assigns.

**FURTHER RESOLVED,** that for and on behalf of the Governing Body, **Ken Jordan, Mayor** is hereby authorized, empowered, and directed to certify these resolutions.

Passed and approved this 9<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2017.

**The fourth** discussion/action item was to discuss and consider approving and authorizing the Mayor of the City of San Saba to enter into an Interlocal Agreement with San Saba County to be signed at a later date, for Emergency Medical Services within the City pursuant to Chapter 791, Tex. Govt. Code. Robert Meyers, Supervisor for Lifeguard Emergency Medical Services filling in for Chief Chris Furry, addressed the Council to provide information about their services and what they can provide. Mayor Jordan asked Mr. Meyers where they will operate out of and how many on staff. Mr. Meyers responded by explaining there would be one fully staffed unit at all times and have four in Brownwood and run backup out of Brownwood. Mayor Jordan asked where else were they located. Mr. Meyers said Crockett, Houston, Texas Florida, Tennessee, Alabama, and they are the same parent company as Air Evac. Mayor Pro-Tem Amthor explained that a lot of the Citizens have Scott & White Insurance and where will they be transported. Mr. Meyers responded and said that they



would be transported to the nearest Hospital that has a surgeon, they can transport to any hospital. Mayor Pro-Tem Amthor asked about a heart condition. Mr. Meyers said they would go to the closest facility and if it was a traumatic situation, they would bring a helicopter and go to the closest trauma center. Mayor Jordan asked if they were tied to Brownwood Hospital and Mr. Meyers responded no, they weren't. Alderman Behrens asked if they would give the Patient a choice. Mr. Meyers said yes, depending on the situation. Marsha Hardy addressed the Council explaining that Marble Falls is working with Memorandums of understanding with contiguous units. Mr. Meyers said that they want to provide the best service possible. Mayor Jordan asked about 911 calls and Marsha Hardy responded by explaining that there would be one mobile and one handheld and they would be P25 compliant. Mayor Pro-Tem Amthor asked if there would be staff here. Mr. Meyers replied that there would be one unit, one EMS, and one Paramedic, a two-man team at all times. He also explained that there is no such thing as volunteers. City Manager Weik addressed Mr. Meyers and asked when is the start day and Mr. Myers said that it is August 1<sup>st</sup>. Marsha Hardy reiterated that there would be one unit here at all times and a backup. Mr. Meyers said they provide continuing education and their Philosophy is patient based and if issues arise they try to take care of asap. I am in charge of supplies and they have never asked why I spent so much money. Mr. Weik asked what is the length of the contract and Marsha Hardy responded by saying it is a three-year contract with a one to two-year option. There are first responders and they provide education so if something happened, they would go and stabilize. Chris Perry said they the First Responders are registered as their own and the initial conversation with the Judge was to expand across the County. Mr. Meyers thanked the Council and said if they had any further questions, to give him a call. City Manager Weik explained that the current Interlocal agreement says that the City agrees to pay to the County 44% of the Ambulance service monthly charges and in the new Agreement the City will agree to pay the 44% of the Ambulance service monthly charges. On a motion by Alderman Oliver, seconded by Alderman Behrens, Council unanimously approved authorizing the Mayor of the City of San Saba to enter into an Interlocal Agreement with San Saba County to be signed at a later date, for Emergency Medical Services within the City pursuant to Chapter 791, Tex. Govt. Code.

**The final** discussion/action item was to discuss additional Financial obligations for Emergency Medical Services and options to pay for this service. The Council discussed information provided by City Attorney, Barbara Boulware-Wells discussing an Emergency Services District. No action was taken.

### **CITY MANAGER'S REPORT**

City Manager Stan Weik gave a brief report on the following activities in the City of San Saba: Updated the Council on the situation with the fish dying, spoke to Texas Parks and Wildlife and they explained that the fish are spawning, there is a lot of algae, and not enough oxygen, a natural occurrence; Scott and the guys completed demolition of the house for the Community Project.

### **OTHER REPORTS**

Tony Guidroz, EDC Director thanked Andy Hansen and Wes Bishop for coming out and we look forward to working with them, Fifteen upcoming events, Northern buildings coming along, Sharon O'Neill doing a great job; Scott Glaze, Public Works Supervisor reported Luis Rios, Street Supervisor brought some top soil in and leveled the lot for the Community Project, thanked Randy Robinson for his efforts with this project.

Department patching streets and cleaning drainage ditches; Tony Guidroz reported getting ready for events, contacted Found Media for the Golf Course, Farmers Market to start 1<sup>st</sup> Wednesday in May, Hoffpaur Auto and the Outdoor sponsoring TG Sheppard, Mentoring Program with the City of Junction, City of San Saba continues to get praises.



All agreed to move the meeting from Tuesday, June 13, 2017 to Monday, June 12, 2017.

As there was no further discussion, the meeting adjourned at 7:00 p.m. and the Council took a short break before Convening into Executive Session.
